



when digital technologies At time revolutionized the way we live and work and all aspects of our lives, we believe it is more crucial than ever to provide high quality, sector-specific training opportunities which allow educators to update their skills and embrace effective digital teaching and learning. It is also vital that young people and adults are given opportunities in digital upskilling for increased employability skills. For this reason, CSI EU aims to increase the ability and motivation of youth/adult educators to incorporate cultural social innovation activities into their curricula/teaching strategies, with a particular focus on increasing their confidence in using digital tools. The CSI EU project will do this by developing:



#### A GUIDE CULTURAL SOCIAL INNOVATION (2021-22)

This publication draws on extensive research into the state of cultural social innovation across the EU and UK, as well as the approaches, methods and tools used to carry out these projects. The Guide raises awareness and commitment to introducing CSI into the education of adults and young people, it aims to inspire and cultivate the creativity skills that is essential in the culture-based social innovation process, aided with the use of digital tools.

#### THE DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION TOOLBOX (2022).

The toolkit follows on from the in-depth research undertaken in the aforementioned guide. While the Guide to cultural social innovation is research based, the Toolkit will be centred on practical guidance and tools for adult and youth educators wishing to incorporate cultural social innovation activities into their training and teaching strategies, with a particular focus on increasing their confidence in using digital tools.

CULTURAL SOCIAL INNOVATION HACKATHON AND GUIDE (2022-23). Will be an intensive 1- or 2-day cultural social innovation training for both adult/youth educators and young adults on how to carry out/develop CSI projects. The guide makes a

clear case of the relevance of a Hackathon for adult and youth educators to implement this new pedagogic approach, and provide a step by step guide on how to organise a hackathon.

Our toolkit is designed to teach you **OUR TOP 20 TOOLS** in under an hour each. It follows a simple four step process and our hope and aim is to encourage you to try one or two tools initially, gauge the impact for yourself then learn some more!

### Who is the Toolbox for?

The Toolbox is designed to provide practical guidance and tools for young people and adults wishing to enhance their digital skills, the toolbox will also guide the adult educators and youth workers seeking to incorporate culture-based social innovation activities into their teaching strategies, with a particular focus on increasing their confidence in using digital tools and apps.

### Top 20 digital tools

The opportunities of cultural social innovation is enhanced with the utilisation of digital tools or apps as it enables young people and adults to undertake cultural social innovation activities that tackle pressing societal issues felt in local and national societies. Therefore, we have identified 20 highly usable resources to offer concise, actionable information about their pedagogic contribution, allowing educators to quickly review each tool and choose those of most interest, then learn quickly and implement with students. The six categories are:



These tools allow educators/young adults to use the power visual storytelling to present and animate ideas and concepts incorporating text, video and graphics.



These tools enable young adults to discuss ideas or matters concerning social innovation with peers, educators and the public. They provide a path to wide ranging networks.



These tools enable people involved in a common task to collaborate share and coauthor digital files through cloud computing.



These tools enable young adults/educators to seek knowledge, funds, or services from a large body of people online for their cultural social innovation activity.



These tools enable young people to gain an interest in culture and art, and provide inspiration for cultural social innovation problems/opportunities to get involved with.



These tools enable young adults to inform (get informed), to persuade, to provide access, or to get involved in civic/democratic issues

# PRESENTATION TOOLS







Canva is a web-based graphic design platform for creating different visual content: posters, presentations, CVs, infographics, calendars, booklets etc. It is free to use for personal or commercial purposes with collaboration availability. Canva is easy to use: users can select an appropriate template from more than 250000 free templates, and drag-and-drop elements (text, photos etc) into design.

Educators can use Canva for creating learning materials, worksheets, learning plans, and presentations for their classes. Canva also has a free extension for education and distance learning. Educators / youth workers can publish assignments and activities for learners, and share their designs to Google Classroom and Microsoft Teams. Learners can use Canva to design and create their learning portfolios, and make group projects with up to 10 members.

Canva offers its paid version Canva Pro (109.99 per year) with unlimited access to premium tools and content, and with 100GB of cloud storage: https://www.canva.com/pricing/.

- Save your work to your own computer as a picture, GIF animation, video, PDF or MS PowerPoint document.

Free version users can create only up to two folders in cloud storage








Prezi is a web-based tool for creating presentations (called prezis for short). Prezi is the evolution of a dull and monotonous PowerPoint in which the audience can interact with the content. Leaving aside the old slides that move forward and backward like pages in a book, in Prezi, you show the big picture and then zoom in to reveal the relationships between your ideas. Prezi offers a wide variety of reusable templates that will blow your imagination, and help you start your project. So even if you are not a designer, this web-based tool is made for you. In the last few years, it has become popular in schools, universities, and businesses. So, if you are trying to engage your learners in interactive lessons, Prezi is the way to success. It has 3 core interfaces which users can utilise to meet their needs: Prezi presentation tool, Prezi Video and Prezi Design.

- Non-linear navigation The signature navigation in Prezi offers a unique perspective for creating and viewing a presentation.



#### **LIMITATIONS**

- No free version- ranges from 6 euro/mo to 19 euro/mo
- Can be difficult to navigate when starting out with the tool.





Over 4 million learners use ThingLink for creating accessible, visual learning experiences in the cloud. It is a way of providing information in a visual format, making it more interactive when presenting ideas. ThingLink encourages users to become confident in using multiple forms of media to express themselves. The desktop editor supports collaborative editing of images and the creation of courses and assignments. The mobile app can be used to save notes with direct audio recording to images. ThingLink offers an easy way to create audio-visual material to empower users and develop their digital literacy skills, and create engaging projects in a language they can understand.



# SOCIAL TECHNOLOGIES



### **Facebook Groups**



A Facebook Group is a place for group communication and for people to share their common interests and express their opinion. They let people come together around a common cause, issue or activity to organize, express objectives, discuss issues, post photos, and share related content. Groups are meant to be a circle of people who share and keep in touch on Facebook. Groups can have a wide range of sizes ranging from close contacts to open networks that allow many people to join and contribute. Groups can be established by networks of educators who wish to share ideas and techniques for teaching cultural social innovation, or by students who wish to learn more about the topic of cultural social innovation. Groups can also be established and shared by educators and students where lessons, content and event details can be shared between the two groups.

Facebook Groups are free to use, as long as you have Facebook profile, which is also free to set up.



#### **LEARN FROM OTHERS**

- A closed group inspires trust and cooperation between it's members.
- Free to use
- Easy for finding and contacting people with similar ideas;
- Accessible on all mobile devices and in almost every country
- It's easier for users to engage freely in conversations knowing that only other members can see and comment, rather than the entire Facebook audience.



#### **LIMITATIONS**

- Features can be quite limited beyond sharing and commenting, further action requires the members initiative
- Unless settings are changed, there will be notifications every time someone comments in the group.
- The Group timeline/newsfeed shows the latest posts on top which means posts are constantly changing order or can get lost depending on the frequency.




LinkedIn is a professional networking and professional development site, designed to help people make business and professional connections, share their experiences and resumes, and find jobs and likeminded people. LinkedIn is quite similar to social networking sites like Facebook but it is more professional. It's based on principles like connecting to people, posting updates, sharing and liking content, and instant messaging other members. Your profile, for example, becomes a resume, complete with work/life experience, accomplishments, recommendations, and referrals from colleagues. LinkedIn supports hundreds of thousands of job seekers and self-employed people, it helps nonprofit organizations scale their impact, share and celebrate how different people come up with solutions in different countries and it also mobilises members to make a difference in their communities both online and in person, which makes it a great tool for cultural social innovation. - Connections Won't Necessarily Happen In Real-Time





#### Chanty






Chanty is a cloud-based collaboration platform that combines communication, project management, and automation to help teams work together more effectively. It's a single hub for neatly organized tasks, conversations, pinned messages, and all the other content you share. You will have quick access to your entire message history and easily find people from your team. Moreover, activate Conversation actions via the three-dot menu to pin messages, rename or leave conversations in a single click. Whether it's a Teambook hub or any given conversation - you are in command leading the way.

Chanty features a free plan for teams with up to 10 members. This free plan which covers most basic functions within Chanty. They also offer a business plan, which starts at \$3 per user, per month, and delivers additional features and unlimited members.





Getting started with Slack can be as simple as downloading the software. Slack is the foundation of teamwork and shared understanding across your team. It helps you communicate and collaborate without emails by setting a standard for online team communication. Millions of people are using Slack to bring their teams together and drive their business forward.


Once you and your colleagues have downloaded Slack, there are many ways you can incorporate it into your business operations. The most basic way to use Slack is as an instant messenger, for both one-on-one communication and group discussions. This allows teams to remotely discuss a project and share files as easily as they could if they were in the same room. Slack can also be used for phone calls, video chats, and screen sharing.

The layout is flexible. New channels can be created and removed at any time, for any purpose. Users can jump in and out of channels whenever needed. Within channels, you can create threads that help organize multiple conversations going on at once. These side chats help prevent tangents from distracting from the primary focus.

- Instant communication: Slack operates in real-time and can be used on nearly any mobile connected device.
- Searchable history: This log of interactions can be invaluable. In the paid versions, you can search every file and conversation in Slack.
- Shared files: Documents can be shared in real-time right within your Slack channels. You can comment on a specific document and get instant feedback.
- Public and private channels: This gatekeeping feature of Slack is very useful. You can limit channels or group chats to just the individuals involved in a project or open it up to the entire company.



#### **LIMITATIONS**

- Messages can get disorganized and chaotic: When you have several people collaborating on a
  project in a chat format, the information can get buried quickly. Slack moves quickly and it can
  be hard to keep track of what's going on.
- Addictive by nature: With push notifications and emojis, Slack has much of the addictive quality of social media.
- Can be shallow: Compared to face-to-face meetings, it's difficult to have substantive conversations via instant messages.



### **OpenIdeo**




OpenIDEO is a crowdsourcing platform that enables people around the globe to come together and build solutions for current societal problems. OpenIDEO collaborates with world-class partners to bring together diverse communities that collectively develop ideas and accelerate social innovation. OpenIDEO's platform equips participants with resources, connections, and design tools to create real impact. OpenIDEO is part of IDEO, a global design and innovation consultancy, which uses open innovation to help people connect and address a wide range of societal issues. IDEO.org is IDEO's nonprofit sister organisation, which focuses on designing products and services that improve the lives of people in poor and vulnerable communities.

#### **LIMITATIONS**

 OpenIDEO's platform expands on the power of crowdsourcing, i.e. on openly sharing and building upon each other's ideas. However, there may be special cases where highly sensitive or technical information may be difficult to share publicly and openly on the platform. In such cases, participants can share a high-level conceptual explanation of their idea, but it might be difficult for others to get a sense of its potential, and offer valuable feedback.






InnoCentive is an open innovation and crowdsourcing company. It enables global businesses, governments, public sector organisations and charities to put their unsolved problems and unmet needs, which are framed as 'Challenges', out to the crowd to address. The crowd can either be external (i.e., InnoCentive's global community of 500,000 expert problem solvers) or internal (i.e., an organisation's employees, partners or customers). Awards, typically monetary, are given for submissions that meet the requirements set out in the Challenge description.

#### **LIMITATIONS**

sensitive or technical information may be difficult to share publicly and openly on the
platform. In such cases, participants can share a high-level conceptual explanation of
their idea, but it might be difficult for others to get a sense of its potential, and offer
valuable feedback.

Kickstarter is a public benefit corporation that maintains a global crowdfunding platform focused on creative projects (arts, comics & illustration, design & tech, film, food & craft, games, music, publishing). People who back Kickstarter projects are offered tangible rewards or experiences in exchange for their pledges. This model traces its roots to the subscription model of arts patronage, where artists would go directly to their audiences to fund their work.

- Kickstarter offers resources for creators interested in running a Kickstarter project.
- The Kickstarter platform is open to backers from anywhere in the world and to creators from many countries.
- Kickstarter has established the all-or-nothing model as a measure to protect creators, and to minimise risk for everyone.
- Unlike many forums for fundraising or investment, Kickstarter claims no ownership over the projects and the work creators produce.
- The webpages of projects launched on Kickstarter are permanently archived and accessible to the public.



## **LIMITATIONS**

- Kickstarter applies a 5% fee on the total amount of the funds raised. Their payments processor applies an additional 3-5% fee.
- There is no guarantee that people who post projects on Kickstarter will deliver on their projects, or that the completed projects will meet backers' expectations. But Kickstarter has measures to protect its community, and processes to report projects violating its Rules, Community Guidelines, or Terms of Use.



Indiegogo (https://www.indiegogo.com) is a crowdfunding platform that allows people to collect funds for an idea, charity, or start-up business. The site runs on a rewards-based system, meaning donors, investors, or customers who are willing to help to fund a project or product can donate and receive a gift (perk), rather than an equity stake in the company.

- Indiegogo provides the freedom to raise funding for anything and from everywhere in the world.
- When a crowdfunding campaign ends successfully, Indiegogo InDemand provides the opportunity to continue raising funds and building the backer community after the end of the campaign.



## **LIMITATIONS**

- Indiegogo charges a 5% platform fee on all funds raised for a campaign. Fees are calculated and deducted from the funds that are actually raised (not the set goals). Its payment processor also charges a processing fee that varies according to the campaigner's location and currency.
- Failure to provide monthly updates and maintain open communication may result in restrictions to individual Indiegogo accounts or suspension of campaigns.



Google Arts & Culture has been developed by Google as a free to download app with free to access content. There is also a website version of Google Arts & Culture that can be found at artsandculture.google.com. Both the app and the website display an online collection of high-resolution images of works of art exhibited in various museums around the world in the "explore" session. They offer virtual tours of galleries and cultural landmarks using the same technology as Google's Street View. The tool also features a special robotic camera, the Art Camera, which is used for the digitization of images. The "play" session of Google Arts & Culture offers engaging and interactive features that invite the user to learn and take part in the art and culture in a fun way. Art Selfie, which invites the user to take a selfie, upload it on the app, and search through thousands of artwork that would look like the user's selfie. Other games are excellent to use in class for students to practise and test their knowledge individually or collectively (multiplayer games). Google Arts & Culture is a great tool for educators as it makes landmarks, exhibitions and museums virtually accessible to anyone in a fun and engaging way using digital tools and advanced technology.

ShowAround is a different approach to cultural heritage and tourism. The concept of ShowAround involves local people of all ages and backgrounds in learning, representing and sharing the culture of their community, making them more engaged and proactive in the preservation and transfer of heritage. ShowAround is a platform where locals can register and offer their tour guide services to travellers. Currently, the site features over 6000 locals in about 8000 cities worldwide. Locals are able to create their profiles, suggest the tour they wish to give, and fix a small fee for it. They do not need to be experts to offer tours, the point of the platform being to give the opportunity to everyone to be part of the cultural sharing and representation of their community on one hand, and to make local knowledge more accessible and authentic on the other. Since the platform gives the chance to anyone to share their cultural knowledge and passion, it is a great opportunity for students to become participatory in the cultural heritage of their community and feel more connected to their cultural heritage in an engaging and practical way. The platform can be found as a website here showaround.com and as an app on As a local tour guide, the registration is free. An 18% commission is deducted from the tour fee earned by the tour guide.



## CIVIC GOOD TOOLS





Eurodesk is a European youth information network created in 1990. As a support organisation to Erasmus+, Eurodesk makes information on learning mobility comprehensive and accessible to young people and those who work with them.

With a network of 38 Eurodesk Centres connected to local information providers in 36 European countries, Eurodesk raises awareness on European opportunities and encourages young people to become active citizens. Eurodesk federates over 1500 so-called "multipliers and ambassadors" that are regional or local organisations working with young people, delivering youth information and advising young people on mobility opportunities.

The Eurodesk opportunity finder has five elements that aim to enable young people and youth workers to find suitable opportunities under 1) learning, 2) volunteering, 3) Internships, 4) participating and 5) grants, with the overarching aim to encourage young people to become active citizens.

With over 7 million users, the platform is the largest political dialogue portal in Germany. openPetition is non-profit, non-partisan, transparent and almost exclusively funded by donations.


The platform supports users in creating their petition, collecting signatures and submitting the petition to the appropriate recipient. Petitions can be created in connection with all kind of initiatives in community and local level / regional / national or transnational, EU level. It is available in 27 European languages, and it is totally free for the users.

Openpetition aims to strengthen participation in democratic life, have policies more visible and transparent, as well as to modernise parliamentary democracy by using digital tools.

Decidim is a Free Open-Source participatory democracy platform for cities and organizations. Developed in Barcelona, Spain and already used by hundreds of cities, Decidim is a digital tool that helps to strengthen civic participation and put it into practice. It is suitable for strategic planning, support for participatory processes, convening meetings and gatherings, launching civic initiatives. In addition, it can be useful not only for local governments, but also for non-governmental organizations or even a parent community to make decisions based on full necessary information, in a transparent and the most democratic way possible.

Decidim promotes a democratic governance with digital infrastructure in response to citizen participatory demand where have ability to manage any participatory process, such as participatory budgeting and citizens' proposals. It combines elements from both direct and representative democracy: Citizens have the power to decide on policy proposals and politicians assume the role of policy implementation




FoodCloud is a social enterprise with a mission to transform surplus food into opportunities to make the world a kinder place. FoodCloud provides unwanted food to charities and people who need it. FoodCloud do this through utilising i) food that has gone past its sell by date, but is still edible ii) donations of food from the public (shelf stable, tamperproof foods) are also accepted, iii) collecting food from farmers that may be misshapen, have blemishes or are mechanically damaged. These foods are fine for human consumption, but supermarkets may view these foods as unsellable. Similarly, FoodCloud also offers Gleaning services. Gleaning is the act of gathering left over food from a farmer's crops when they have been harvested, or if it is uneconomic to harvest the crops, gleaning ensures that the food does not get wasted.
